

FRANÇOIS CORBIN

François has been in the professional audio industry since 1980. For decades, he operated his own audio business in Quebec City. In 2008, he started to work at d&b audiotechnik. At the beginning of this new chapter, he did multiple 3D audio models for d&b, supported sound systems' listening evaluation and offered support to d&b customers. Now, he is still doing these tasks and he is also developing new markets for d&b in Canada. During his career, François has been involved in several sales projects in various venues such as theatres, houses of worship, stadiums, and arenas. François speaks 3 languages: French, English and Pro Audio.



SHOLEM DOLGOY

Sholem Dolgoy is one of Canada's leading senior lighting designers working in theatre, dance, opera, corporate, exhibit, and special events. He was the Company Lighting Designer for the National Ballet of Canada and had guest positions at Shaw Festival, Vancouver Opera, and other producers across the country. His Broadway debut was with Sharon, Lois and Bram. Corporate events include Toyota, Chrysler, and Nortel. Museum work includes ROM, Saskatoon's Western Development Museum, and Old Fort Erie. Sholem began teaching lighting design at Ryerson Theatre School in 1980 and has been on full time faculty since 2002. A member of Associated Designers of Canada.



ADAIR ARKO

Adair Arko works for d&b audiotechnik in the Education and Application Support department. She earned her Master of Fine Arts degree in Theatrical Sound Design and Engineering, and worked in musical theatre and drama prior to joining d&b. She is based out of Cleveland, Ohio.



VICTOR SVENNINGSON

Victor spent his whole professional life in some aspect of technical entertainment; his early days as a sound designer for Festival Lennoxville, Toronto Workshop Productions and the Shaw Festival. From there to a TD for Harbourfront Centre and twenty years at the Mississaugas Living Arts Centre (LAC). He also spent a few years working for Strand Lighting Canada as a sales rep. Victor has lived in Port Hope for just over twenty years and has volunteered as PM for the All Canadian Jazz Festival and is a founding member of Northumberland 89.7. He is also a founding member of the Canadian Institute for Theatre Technology (CITT), and current treasurer of the Ontario Section.



RHONDA HOLMES

Rhonda Holmes started as a freelance stagehand in Ottawa, ON in 1996, having graduated from Algonquin College's Television Broadcasting program, and came to Toronto in 2000. She worked as a freelancer in both the entertainment and television industries for many years, and soon her experience led her to IATSE Local 58 as a Rigger; she is now a full member. As a mom she realized she didn't want to work crazy hours anymore, so when a sales position opened up at AC Lighting, she gladly accepted it. After nearly nine years of selling and creating custom LED fixtures for productions such as Marilyn Denis and the Vancouver Olympics, she took up a new challenge as a Project Manager with Scene Scapin Toronto. It was a great experience working on the Aga Khan Museum Theatre and the redesign of the Toronto Centre for the Arts Greenwin Theatre. She is currently an Outside Sales Representative for Technically Yours Inc, representing Rose Brand in Canada.
