

Not all bulbs are created equal Theatrical Bulbs can be more confusing than they should be.

The time has come, you need to replace the bulbs in your stage lighting fixtures. So what are you going to do? You need to make sure you get the right bulb, that much you know but how do you tell which one is right?

Here are some quick tips to help you find the right

- 1) ANSI CODE Check for an ANSI code. Normally three letters the ANSI Code number is the first clue to which bulb you need. You should find this on the base of the bulb.
- 2) Check the BASE There are five different bases found on most theatrical bulbs. Bi-Pin (most ellipsoidals, Lekos, Source4 fixtures), Medium Prefocus (most theatrical fresnels and some older ellipsoidals), Double Ended (cyc lights and some moving lights), Screw Based (usually older Colortran Mini's), and MR16 (which is really not just a base category as much as a completely different kind of bulb used in small moving lights, blinders and some followspots).
- 3) **WATTAGE** There are lots of different wattages. It's important to know what the maximum allowed wattage is for your fixture. Just because a 1000W bulb fits doesn't mean you should use it. If a light fixture is approved for use in Canada (CSA approved) then it will have a maximum wattage marked on a label, somewhere on the fixture.
- 4) **VOLTAGE -** Some bulbs are available in various voltage models. Normally any voltage between 110V and 130V. But what does that mean? Well, a 110V bulb will be nice and bright when you're feeding it with 120V of power. But it will not last nearly as long as the manufacturer suggests it will last. A 120V bulb feed with 115V will last longer than spec, but not be guite as bright. This helps to explain why sometimes you have two fixtures, both have the same ANSI code and the only difference is the voltage. One fixture is brighter (or dimmer) than the
- 5) COLOUR TEMPERATURE Every bulb should have a colour temperature rating. If you're not familiar with the concept of colour temperature the easiest way to think of it is like this. What colour is white? Is white more amber or more blue? A typical colour temperature for a theatrical bulb is 3200 K (Kelvin) although there are other colour temperatures available depending on the bulb you have. It's a good idea to know what you have, but if you didn't purchase the original bulb, it can be hard to tell which one you have. Keep in mind that the colour temperature of the bulb you choose can have an affect on the lamp life. Higher colour temperatures typically results in low hours.
- 6) LAMP LIFE So, you have gone through everything else and you think you have the right



bulb. Have you considered the lamp life? The estimated life of a bulb is typically indicated by the manufacturer, however it's good to know what factors impact lamp life. We already mentioned Colour Temperature and Voltage. But you need to keep in mind that fixture focus position can have an impact. That's not something you really can do much about when you are buying the bulb, but it is something to keep in mind when you're wondering why a bulb is not lasting as long as you had hoped.

So there you go. You're set. So when the time comes call us and we'll help you find the bulb you

Technology Tips... Did you know?

Roll it off... just push the button and roll it off!

A common issue found in live sound situations is low frequency build up or rumble. Although the issue and the corresponding fix can sometimes be complicated, often the fix is really simple. Just push the HPF button.

HPF stands for <u>High Pass Filter</u>. Essentially what that button does is allows audio higher than the designated frequency to pass through the channel strip. Any frequencies below the predetermined frequency are "rolled off". On many consoles, like the one in the picture here, the HPF



is predetermined at 100Hz. Engaging this filter helps to cut the low frequency content introduced from other sources (ie drums, bass guitar, HVAC system) that would result in degradation of the sound. Think about it. How many instruments or vocals in your system are really using frequencies that low? Not too many. Activate those HPF buttons and listen to see what happens. Let us know if it helps clean up your sound.
